



Health charter

related to the Covid-19 epidemic

Version 14 / 4th August 2022

PREAMBLE:

This charter is a global vision of the instructions and means to protect people and limit the spread of the SARS-CoV-2 virus. It is a tool for adapting to the health requirements linked to the epidemic. However, it must be systematically linked to the legal and regulatory requirements specified by the French government. These requirements are constantly being updated, which is why we invite you to contact the Site Operations department to get the most up-to-date information (opsite@lourdes-france.com / Tel.: 05 62 42 78 04).

The increase in COVID-19 contaminations means we need to be more vigilant.

We are all concerned about the arrival of pilgrims and we must work together to maintain the best possible sanitary conditions. The Health Charter of the Sanctuary of Lourdes is our reference and aims to protect, in particular, the most vulnerable.

This is why in the Accueils, for those aged of 12 and above, vaccination is still an obligatory requirement for hospitaliers, both caregivers AND non-caregivers who are in contact with the sick, just as it is for the staff in these establishments.

Together, we need to make the following recommendations:

- Remind pilgrims of the basic hygiene measures
- use of alcohol-based hand gel, hand washing, sensible social distancing, etc.).
- Wear a facemask in enclosed places (churches, meeting rooms, etc.) where there are a lot of people.
- In enclosed and covered areas, leave doors and windows open as much as possible.

In addition, the Sanctuary strongly advises everyone to carry out an antigen test before travelling. It is part of our responsibility to reiterate the importance of recommending all these measures, in the hope that they will be reassuring and understood.



Vaccination requirement

In the Accueils, for those aged of 12 and above, vaccination (2 doses + booster dose*) is still an obligatory requirement for hospitaliers, both caregivers AND non-caregivers who are in contact with the sick, just as it is for the staff in these establishments. Wearing a facemask remains compulsory.

Each director or head of service is responsible for checking his or her own pilgrims who will be given a wristband, verifying their vaccination status, valid for the length of their stay.

^{*} for numbers of doses in specific cases (Janssen vaccine, covid positivity, etc.), refer to Article 2 of Decree No. 2022-1097 of 30th July 2022 relating to monitoring and security measures retained in the fight against Covid-19.



Wearing a mask

Wearing a facemask is obligatory in:

- * in the Accueils Notre Dame and Saint Frai
- * at the first aid station
- * inside the Baths

In the rest of the site, the sanctuary strongly advises wearing a facemask in enclosed spaces when there are a lot of people.





INSTRUCTIONS:

- Bring your own alb; a chasuble and the stole will be lent to you by the sanctuary.
- When you arrive in the church, sanitise your hands.
- Make your way to the sacristy.

REQUIREMENTS:

1 hand gel dispenser per entrance.



INSTRUCTIONS:

- Maintain social distancing.
- If you are concelebrating, take Communion by intinction after sanitising your hands. The hosts are prepared by the sacristan.
- Communion takes place at several different places, the faithful are guided by the priest, the sacristan, or the hospitality.
- Before giving Communion, sanitise your hands; do not give Communion by mouth but in the hand.
- Place used liturgical vessels on the credenza.

REQUIREMENTS:

The stoops are empty. Bottle of hand gel in the choir.



AFTER

INSTRUCTIONS:

- Go back to the sacristy.
- Sanitise your hands.

REQUIREMENTS:


Rack for chasubles. 1 hand gel dispenser. Waste bin.



Confession

at the Chapel of Reconciliation

DURING



INSTRUCTIONS:

- Enter by the central doors.
- Sanitise your hands with anti-bacterial hand gel.
- Sit down on a free bench (one person per bench).
- Wait for a priest to come and get you.
- Priests must bring their own albs.

REQUIREMENTS:

Regulations clearly displayed. 1 hand gel dispenser at the entrance. Permanent mechanical ventilation.




INSTRUCTIONS:

- Sanitise your hands.
- Enter the confessional, close the door, and sit down.
- Disinfect surfaces with the available wipes
- A screen separates you from the priest.
- On leaving the confessional, wipe down the areas you have touched.

REQUIREMENTS:

Regulations clearly displayed. 1 hand gel dispenser at the entrance to each confessional. Permanent mechanical ventilation of confessionals. Glass partition between the priest and the penitent. Anti-bacterial wipes in each confessional.





INSTRUCTIONS:

- Sanitise your hands.
- Disabled access is available through the West door (on the permanence side) with the ramp.

REQUIREMENTS:

Regulations clearly displayed. 1 hand gel dispenser at the entrance.

INSTRUCTIONS:

- Avoid browsing through books and touching objects unless you intend to make a purchase.
- Ask the staff to help you find what you require.
- There will be screens between customers and the checkout assistant.
- Use contactless payment where possible.

REQUIREMENTS:

Glass screens at each checkout. Anti-bacterial wipes.





INSTRUCTIONS:


- Sanitise your hands.

Regulations clearly displayed . 1 hand gel dispenser at the exit.













- Your director will have a direct link to the Sanctuary's first-aid post.
- If you are unable to self-isolate during your pilgrimage, you are invited to stay in Sanctuary accommodation where a protocol is already in place.
- Prepare for your return by contacting your insurer who can advise you of the conditions for your repatriation.

REQUIREMENTS:

Application of the Accueil Notre-Dame *protocol. Link between pilgrimage's safety contact person and the first-aid post.*

• Follow your health insurance measures.



Staying at and serving in the Accueils - preparing for your visit Accueils Notre-Dame and Saint-Frai

The text below has been approved by Dr Alessandro de FRANCISCIS (Permanent Doctor of the Sanctuary)

General principles of organisation

• Before your arrival, you will have appointed a COVID contact person responsible for liaising with the equivalent person at the Accueil, and for preparing your accompanying hospitality volunteers in the actions and processes of caring for accompanied people during the COVID pandemic.

• Each person in the care of your hospitality will have been accepted onto the pilgrimage following a decision taken by the referring doctor of your organisation. The latter will have assessed both the potential risks to the person and the capacities of the hospitality volunteers to provide personalised care. The referring doctor will also have approved the conditions of the person's accommodation in this COVID climate.

• In the Accueils, for those aged of 12 and above, vaccination (2 doses + booster dose*) is still an obligatory requirement for hospitaliers, both caregivers AND non-caregivers who are in contact with the sick, just as it is for the staff in these establishments.

Wearing a facemask remains compulsory.

• The managers of the Accueils reserve the right to carry out unannounced checks on vaccination certificates.

General principles for protection against Covid 19

• Staff at the *Accueil* ensure that items are sanitised in the morning, at the beginning of the afternoon and at the end of the evening. This comprises the commonly touched points located in the shared areas: offices, lifts, handrails and railings in corridors and stairs (therefore excluding the bedrooms, offices, treatment rooms, and tearooms that have been assigned to you). Each sanitisation process is fully tracked.

• All bed linen is treated in an industrial laundry that meets professional standards, including in COVID prevention.

• Members of your hospitality must implement a daily protocol of biological cleaning and regular ventilation of bedrooms, tearooms, treatment rooms, shared toilets that have been allocated to you.

• When you are ready to vacate your allocated areas (bedrooms, treatment rooms, offices, tearooms, shared toilets), members of your hospitality must carry out comprehensive sanitisation for which they will have received specific training.

• It is obligatory for all dishes and utensils that have been made available for meals in the dining room to be washed at high temperature in the utility area connected to the dining room.



Staying at and serving in the Accueils - preparing for your visit Accueils Notre-Dame and Saint-Frai

In shared spaces

• At the start of your stay, you will be in contact with the COVID contact person who is part of our team, and who will give you the necessary up-to-date instructions so that the hospitality volunteers who are supporting you can carry out their service in full knowledge of all the facts.

• There is signage in all areas as a reminder of preventative measures as well as the maximum number of people allowed in each occupied area (see the charts displayed for each premises and room occupancy options).

• We provide liquid soap in all wet rooms, and alcohol-based hand gel is freely available from dispensers at all entrances and exits of our Accueil medical facility, in all high-traffic areas, in front of lift cars, and entrances / exits of dining rooms and meeting rooms.



Staying in the Accueils - preparing for your visit Accueils Notre-Dame and Saint-Frai

A CONTRACTOR

The text below has been approved by Dr Alessandro de FRANCISCIS (Permanent Doctor of the Sanctuary)



- Observe the maximum number of people per table. Each guest should be assigned a fixed place for the entire duration of the pilgrimage.
- Written evidence of your safe distancing measures must be shown to the person in charge of the dining room upon arrival.
- Ceiling fans in the dining room should be switched off.

Other measures

- The appropriate number of wheelchairs and the blue 3-wheeled HNDL "voitures" will be assigned to you.
- A hospitality volunteer will sanitise the blue wheelchairs used during transfer after each use.
- We can provide you with protective equipment such as gloves, aprons, disposable mattress pads, etc. as needed. Should you require these, we can provide you with a price list or a list of suppliers.

Testing positive for SARS-CoV-2

• Anyone who has symptoms* must be tested. In the absence of available tests, the Accueil management will direct the pilgrimage doctor towards a practical solution (for example, pharmacies, laboratories). If the test result is positive, it must be reported to the person in charge of the floor. The management will provide a room that is kept available for this eventuality if the person cannot be kept isolated in the room where they are waiting for the next steps that will be explained to you (isolation on site, hospitalisation, or repatriation).


- Serious symptoms: difficulty in breathing or shortness of breath, feeling of pressure or pain in the chest, loss of speech or motor skills.

^{*} Most frequent symptoms: fever, dry cough, tiredness;

⁻ Less common symptoms: body aches, sore throat, diarrhoea, conjunctivitis, headache, loss of smell or taste, rash, or discolouration of fingers or toes;




Getting off the train at Lourdes station






Getting off the plane at the airport


Going to the Accueil Jean-Paul II

INSTRUCTIONS:

- Enter through the central door.
- Respect the markings on the floor if you have to wait.
- Sanitise your hands.
- If taking the stairs, follow the markings on the floor, (one staircase to go up - one staircase to go down).

REQUIREMENTS:

Regulations clearly displayed. 1 hand gel dispenser at the entrance and exit. Establishment of a signposted and wellcommunicated one-way system to ensure the flow of people is safe and to limit cross over. Information and updates every Monday morning on the health protocol.




INSTRUCTIONS:

- Respect the 1.5-metre spacing and the markings on the floor.
- At the HNDL secretarial office, staff are protected by glass screens.
- Wait in the corridor if there are already two people in the office.

REQUIREMENTS:

Regulations clearly displayed.

1 hand gel dispenser at the entrance and exit. Establishment of a signposted and wellcommunicated one-way system to ensure the flow of people is safe and to limit cross over. Screens at the desk.



INSTRUCTIONS:

- Follow the markings on the floor.
- Sanitise your hands.
- Exit through the door indicated.

REQUIREMENTS:

Regulations clearly displayed. 1 hand gel dispenser at the entrance and exit. Establishment of a signposted and wellcommunicated one-way system to ensure the flow of people is safe and to limit cross over.




